NOTARY PUBLIC

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's

in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he /she suspects anything may be false or wrong.

SAINT PATRICK'S DAY

Leprechauns, three leaf clovers, pots of gold, blarney stones, and green beer. Is that what St. Patrick's Day is all about, a celebration of all things Irish? Not exactly. But it is all in the spirit of celebration of a single man and his mission to bring Christianity to the great country of Ireland.

St. Patrick is known as the Patron Saint of Ireland. True, he was not a born Irish. But he has become an integral part of the Irish heritage, mostly through his service across Ireland of the 5th century.

There are differing views about the exact year and place of birth, even his real name is unclear. Patricius was his Romanized name, hence he later came to be familiar as Patrick.

As a child, Patrick was kidnapped by a band of pirates that landed in south Wales and kidnapped him along with many others. They sold him into slavery in Ireland. He was imprisoned there for 6 years, when one day he dreamed of having seen God. Legend says, he was dictated by God to escape with a ship.

His escape led him to Britain, and then to France. There he joined a monastery and spent the next 12 years in training. When he

became a bishop he dreamed that the Irish were calling him back to Ireland to teach them about God.

With the Pope's blessing, he set out to Ireland. There he converted, baptized, and confirmed Irishmen all across his travels. With diplomatic fashion he brought gifts to kinglets and lawgivers, but never accepted gifts in return.

He even made important converts among the royal families. And this fact upset the Celtic Druids. Patrick was arrested several times, but escaped each time. For 20 years he had traveled throughout Ireland, establishing monasteries across the country. He also set up schools and churches which would aid him in his conversion. He developed native clergy, a established dioceses, and held church councils.

By the end of the 7th century Patrick had become a renowned figure. There are many legends associated with St Patrick. And after some 1500 years, these legends have been inseparably combined with the facts. And together they have helped us know much about the Saint and the spirit behind celebration of the day.

Patrick's mission in Ireland lasted for over 20 years. He died on March 17, AD 461. That day has been commemorated as St. Patrick's Day ever since.
